Eastbourne is a large town, seaside resort with a growing population of 120,000, and borough in the non-metropolitan county of East Sussex on the south coast of England 17 miles (27 km) east of Brighton. Eastbourne is located immediately east of Beachy Head, the highest chalk sea cliff in Great Britain and part of the South Downs National Park. # Bankers Corner Size: 6m x 6m

In the heart of the Town Centre on Terminus Road. It has a weekly footfall of 184,320 and is large enough for vehicles, gazebos and promotional buses.



## Arndale Size: 6m x 6m

Located right outside of the Arndale Centre main entrance, just around the corner from Debenhams and Marks and Spencer. It has a weekly footfall of 191,520 and is large enough for vehicles and large gazebos.



# Debenham Size: 6m x 6m

It is great for large promotions such as buses and large gazebos and has a weekly footfall of 100,800. Holds a street market on Wednesdays and Sundays so unavailable on those days. It is situated on the same precinct as many popular cafes and restaurants are locate



## TJ Hughes Size: 6m x 6m

It is located on the top part of Terminus Road only 100 metres away from the seafront so offers a great location to food or beverage companies that may be looking at targeting holiday makers. Its weekly average footfall is 67,200 (off peak) and is large enough for Gazebos and vehicles.
