

Chrisp Street, Poplar Weekly Footfall 65,000

Poplar is a historic, mainly residential area of East London, England, in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. It is about 5.5 miles (8.9 km) east of Charing Cross and a 4 minute journey on the DLR from Canary Wharf. Poplar's real high street is Chrisp Street, which has been a focus of recent regeneration efforts, along with the zone now called Poplar Riverside. A DLR station has opened at Langdon Park and the disused Old Poplar Library has been restored as a 'seedbed' for start-up businesses. A highly pedestrianised, multicultural, local hub with regular street food, summer and winter events.

The East End of London was one of the most heavily targeted places during the Second World War. Poplar, in particular, was struck badly by some of the air raids during the First World War.
