

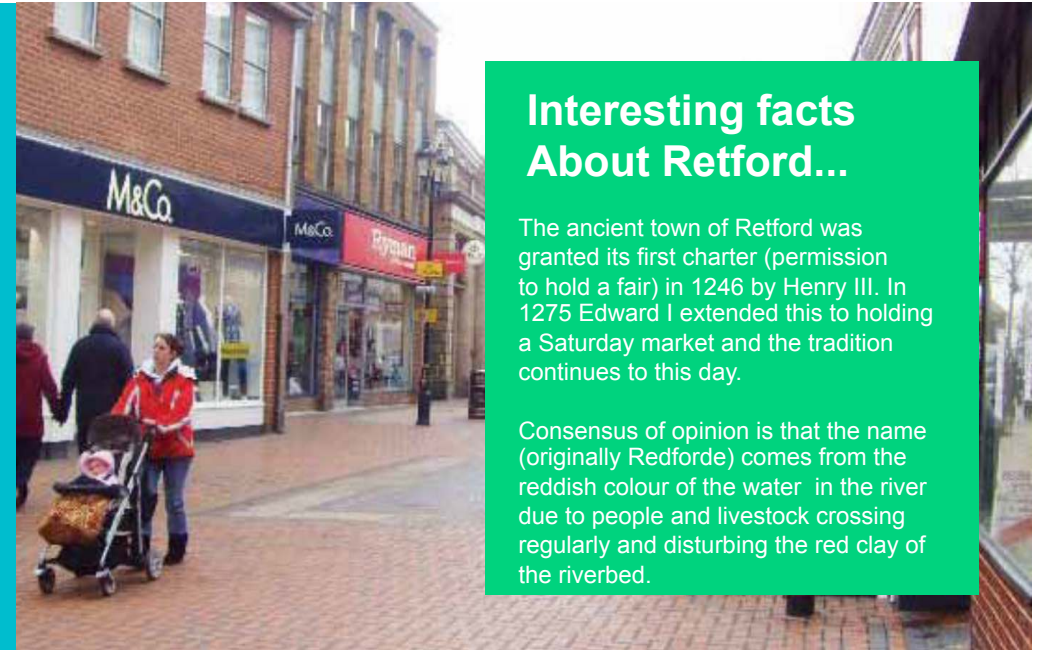
Retford, Nottinghamshire

Retford is a market town in Nottinghamshire. The town is situated in a valley with the River Idle and the Chesterfield Canal running through the centre of the town. It is 25 miles from Chesterfield.

Interesting facts About Retford...

The ancient town of Retford was granted its first charter (permission to hold a fair) in 1246 by Henry III. In 1275 Edward I extended this to holding a Saturday market and the tradition continues to this day.

Consensus of opinion is that the name (originally Redforde) comes from the reddish colour of the water in the river due to people and livestock crossing regularly and disturbing the red clay of the riverbed.

1 Carolgate Street Size: 5m x 4m

The main shopping facilities in Retford are centred on Carolgate together with the nearby square and market place. The pitch is located to the right of HSBC and can accommodate a small trailer or car promotion.

There is also an alternative pitch located a few shops down from the HSBC location, situated in between Costa Coffee and M&Co and is suitable for a car promotion.
