

Stockport, Greater Manchester

Weekly Footfall 200,000

Stockport is a large town in Greater Manchester, England. It lies on elevated ground 7 miles south-east of Manchester city centre, at the point where the rivers

Goyt and Tame merge to create the River Mersey. In recent years, Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council has embarked on an ambitious regeneration scheme, known as Future Stockport.

Interesting facts About Stockport...

Stockport has extensive air raid shelters built in 1938 into the sand stone cliffs and could house several thousand people. Tours in to the shelters are regularly held. The Market Place in the town centre was where public executions were carried out and stocks were located, it is also where the last wife was reputedly sold and brought in England!

Merseyway Shopping Centre is built on stilts above the river Mersey and spans over 400 metre length of the river. Even today, as one of the oldest (built in the 1960's), it is still one of the most successful shopping centre's in the UK.
